Today we observe the Eighteenth Sunday after Trinity. On this day, we remember that Jesus is our one, true Teacher and we rejoice to receive the riches of His instruction. Though the world has much it considers knowledge, only Jesus bring to us full and certain Truth, both in the revelation of God's Law and in the good news of salvation in the Gospel. Today, we sit at our Teacher's feet and receive this glorious teaching with joy.

If you are a <u>VISITOR</u> here, we'd like to offer you our warmest welcome! We pray that your experience among us is blessed, and that you depart filled with God's peace and life.

Also, toward the end of our service today we will be celebrating Holy Communion, in which we will eat and drink Jesus' body and blood, under bread and wine, for the forgiveness of our sins (Matthew 26:26-28). Therefore, we ask that you would please see the statement titled "On the Sacrament of Holy Communion," printed below, which describes our beliefs and practices regarding this sacred gift.

O Lord, my creator, redeemer, and comforter, as I come to worship You in spirit and in truth, I humbly pray that You would open my heart to the preaching of Your Word so that I may repent of my sins, believe in Jesus Christ as my only Savior, and grow in grace and holiness. Hear me for the sake of His name. Amen.

ON THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION: We believe that when we receive Holy Communion together, we are publicly declaring both our unity in Christ and our agreement in doctrine (1 Cor. 10:16-17; 1 Cor. 1:10). We also believe that if we receive this sacrament in unbelief, we risk God's judgment (1 Cor. 11:27-30).

Therefore, communion at this altar is reserved for those who believe and confess the teachings of our church body, The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. Those who have not been formally instructed in our teachings should wait to commune until completing a course of instruction with us.

If you are a <u>VISITOR</u> and would like to commune with us today, please speak with the pastor before the service. If you will not be communing, you are welcome to kneel at the altar with your arms folded across your chest to receive a blessing, or you may simply remain in your pew.



TOILETRY/HYGIENE DONATIONS FOR THE OPEN DOOR OUTREACH CENTER -

We continue to receive hygiene & toiletry products year around for the Open Door Outreach Center in Waterford. There are two bins located on the shelves at the bottom of the sanctuary stairs where you can place product donations. The Open Door is a non-profit organization that assists needy families in the Lakes Area. They are ALWAYS in need of toiletry and hygiene items, so **if you can provide any of these throughout the year, it would be appreciated.**

WE CONTINUE TO COLLECT used postage stamps for Wycliffe Bible Translation Ministries, and used eyeglasses for MOST Ministries in the two plastic bins on the shelves at the bottom of the sanctuary stairs. Wycliffe sells the stamps to stamp collectors and then uses the proceeds to fund Bible translation projects throughout the world. MOST Ministries repairs/refurbishes used eyeglasses and distributes them via eyeglass clinics to the needy around the world. If you donate postage stamps, please be sure to leave ¹/₄" of the envelope paper around the stamp.

THE FATHER'S HANDS FOOD PANTRY AND CLOTHING CLOSET here at St. Paul's Community Lutheran Church has been very busy this spring. We served over 300 families in the pantry alone since January. This has led to a depletion of our supplies. We are in urgent need for the following items:

A LETTER FROM LISA MOYER, Director of Youth and Family Life... – CHRIST LUTHERAN CHURCH

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! I'm writing this letter today to introduce myself as Director of Youth and Family Life at Christ Lutheran Church in Milford.

I am currently in training as a deaconess at the Fort Wayne seminary, scheduled to finish in July of 2025.

As a new staff member at Christ, I will be learning the ins and outs of life in the church. Part of my position is to work closely with the area congregations to encourage life together of our youth and families. There are certainly times and education that needs to be done within the immediate church family. But by sharing resources we can certainly be blessed and encouraged in the receiving of God's gifts. And in time, we will learn what works well for our congregations.

Recent LCMS statistics tell us that only 1 in 5 children baptized in the LCMS remain faithful through young adulthood. We believe that one way to combat this trend is to support the family. To strengthen their ability to do discipleship within the home and give them skills and confidence in their parenting. To that end, we would offer to partner with you in family discipleship.

One of the ways we seek to help one another is through Faith milestone workshops. These milestone workshops encourage parents in their Christian parenting skills and give them an opportunity to pass along faith habits to their children. Our first shared workshop is coming up Saturday October 12, 2024. This father/son retreat gives middle school boys a chance to ask questions in a safe environment with their dads. They will learn about honor, courage, and faithfulness from Biblical narratives. On November 17th we will host a parent workshop on technology for Christians and in February one about dating for 7-9th graders.

We invite your families to join us for any of these workshops and youth events as they are organized throughout the year.
