
Hear us as we pray in His name and as He has taught us:



My name is Bob Alexander. I've been the Director of Worship and Choral director for Cross of Christ Lutheran Church in Bloomfield Hills for many decades now. For the past two years, our congregation has presented, as one of our Advent evenings, a colorful program we call "An **Evening of Carols and Stories**". This year the event will take place on **December 11th** at 7:00pm. This year, we are reaching out you, one of our sister Lutheran congregations in the area in the hopes that you might be interested in joining the choir we assemble for this onenight event. The evening features a number of heartwarming Christmas reminiscences (usually pre-recorded and projected on our large LED screens), a small, but stunning, Christmas organ medley by Mr. Lance Luce, our organist (and, as it happens, the primary organist for The Detroit Red Wings), a selection of familiar carols sung by the congregation, a brief Christmas homily by our pastor, and, as you can imagine, three choral songs presented by a Christmas choir assembled just for the evening's performance. The choir is drawn from congregation members as well as friends, family and community members who simply love to sing. If any of your members who may be interested in joining in on this charming evening. We will be rehearsing the three pieces of choral music on most Wednesday evenings beginning November 6th at 7pm, affording us plenty of opportunities to learn the parts. As is our practice, we will have SATB rehearsal tracks available in CD format or online as MP3s for choir members to access. We will, naturally, issue sheet music (and have printed PDF music available on line) for choir members to use and reference. We will also be open to making music and accompaniment tracks of the songs we will perform available to your congregation in the event you would like to use the music for your own Christmas season performances. Choir members for "An Evening of Carols and Stories" do not need to be especially proficient - we have found the skills needed follow the enthusiasm of the vocalists. We also encourage participation by members of all ages from teens to seniors.
