quilts in 2023! LWR currently spends about \$1.9 million annually to operate this program. They do their best to steward funds efficiently, but the behind-the-scenes operating costs have increased in recent years. (This is largely due to the significant rise in shipping costs since 2020.) You can ensure LWR has the financial resources they need to distribute guilts where they're needed most by donating to the Quilt & Kit Shipping fund. This is a way for the congregation to support the quilt ministry. The Cost to ship just one quilt is \$2.80. St. Mark's Missionary League is accepting Donations to defray the cost of shipping our guilts. Donations can be made by cash or Check. TOILETRY/HYGIENE DONATIONS FOR THE OPEN DOOR OUTREACH CENTER

 We continue to receive hygiene & toiletry products year around for the Open Door Outreach Center in Waterford. There are two bins located on the shelves at the bottom of the sanctuary stairs where you can place product donations. The Open Door is a non-profit organization that assists needy families in the Lakes Area. They are ALWAYS in need of toiletry and hygiene items, so **if you can provide any of these**

throughout the year, it would be appreciated.

WE CONTINUE TO COLLECT used postage stamps for Wycliffe Bible Translation Ministries, and used eyeglasses for MOST Ministries in the two plastic bins on the shelves at the bottom of the sanctuary stairs. Wycliffe sells the stamps to stamp collectors and then uses the proceeds to fund Bible translation projects throughout MOST Ministries the world. repairs/ refurbishes used eyeglasses and distributes them via eyeglass clinics to the needy around the world. If you donate postage stamps, please leave 1/4" of the paper around the stamp.

A member of the Human Care Board will collect them and make the return. AND CLOTHING CLOSET at St. Paul's Community Lutheran Church has been very busy this spring. They have served over 300 families in the pantry alone since January. This has led to a depletion of their supplies. They are in urgent need for the following items:

Powdered milk - 1qt envelopes or boxes Plain pasta - macaroni Spaghetti Noodles Spaghetti Sauce Non-starchy canned vegetables Peas, Corn or mixed vegetables Soups, Rice, Baked beans Protein bars Instant Potatoes Canned Tuna or Chicken Toilet paper, Tooth Paste, Hand sanitizer, Large bars of soap and diapers (size 5)

Basement Leakage: There was some water that got into the basement from outside. Tom Kaufman was mowing the lawn and observed that the downspout wasn't connected to the plastic drainage pipe totally. So Mr. Kaufman reattached the two completely. Will continue to monitor the situation.

Office computer had to be fixed. \$402.60. New Hard Drive had to be installed. There was 2 additional manpower hours as Shepherd's Staff and WD Drive had to be reconnected.

Since the Office and the Treasurer's computers are aged, it was agreed that it would be best if we put a line item budget for next year for a computer/technology fund. This fund will handle costs for any replacements that may need to be made when they occur. This would include the computers (when they need replacing or fixing), and any upgrades that may be needed as software compatibility may have to be upgraded with it. All agreed that this should be done.

The Office is in need of **a paper shredder** so that personal information that becomes obsolete may be destroyed. This shredder will also be shared with the treasurer. It was determined that the budget for this item would not exceed \$80.00.

A Motion was made to approve this request. It passed unanimously.
